


## Total giving, 1979-2019 (in billions of dollars)




## Individual giving as a share of disposable income, 1979-2019

(in current dollars)








#### 2019 contributions: \$449.64 billion by type of recipient organizations






Percentage change from previous year


### Giving by type of recipient: percentage of the total in five-year spans, 1979—2019



- Preaching and teaching generosity year-round.
- One or more churchwide generosity focuses each year.
- Stewardship, giving and generosity are part of your Discipleship Path.
- A clearly articulated Theology of Stewardship/Generosity.





# Tell Your Ministry Story

Effectively communicating how you are transforming lives cuts through what the culture has to say about money.

- Weekly Offering Talks
- Frequent use of story telling in all church communication.
- Focus on one life at a time.
- Share the stories of those impacted by your ministries and those who are transformed because they shared their time and money.





# **Build Donor Relationships**

The church's relationship with its financial supporters is sacred and requires careful tending.

- Pastors must have access to and use donor giving records.
- Express gratitude frequently.
- Build personal relationships with financial leaders first! Learn their passions, motivations and stories of generosity.
- Ask for their wisdom.





# **Build Donor Relationships**

The church's relationship with its financial supporters is sacred and requires careful tending.

- Unleash Entrepreneurs to solve problems.
- Identify potential financial leaders and engage with them on a personal level to discover the joy of generosity.
- Develop your donors of time and talents in the same way.





## Make the Ask

People are most likely to grow their generosity habits when they are challenged to take their next step.

- Annual Giving
- Special Giving
- Capital Giving
- Planned Giving
- Build your ask on the biblical foundation of your theology of generosity.
- Personalize your ask.
- Be clear about what you are asking, what the next step is and when you will follow up.
- Always use personalized communication when asking.
